### YRE254 Oliver River Walk –11 km – Rated 1A

The trail begins at the Oliver Visitor Centre at the old Railway Station, 36205 93rd St. On Hwy 97 from the north, turn left onto 350th Ave, left at 93rd St and follow to the Visitor Centre on the right hand side of the road, opposite the Legion. From the south, right onto 350th Ave, left at 93rd St and follow to the Visitor Centre. Plenty of free parking is available.

1. Welcome to Oliver! Oliver is located near the south end of the Okanagan Valley in south central British Columbia. Just 25 kilometres north of the US border, Oliver sits on the only desert area of Canada. The attractive climate fosters popular tourist activities including summer water sports, golf and sight-seeing. Oliver is an ideal setting for growing Okanagan wine grapes and producing some of the best rated wines in the world! Of course, its mild weather year-round makes Oliver a great place to live.
2. This scenic route follows the Okanagan River to McAlpine Bridge and back. It is nicely treed for shade on the hotter days. There are several locations along the route to swim – as the river is beautiful, clear and refreshing. Bring a picnic snack and a bathing suit during the warm season.
3. From the Visitor Centre, walk to the north i.e. away from 350th Ave. Follow the trail closest to the river all the way up to McAlpine Bridge where Highway 97 crosses the river. Turn around and retrace your steps back to the Visitor Centre.
