



## Volkssport Association of British Columbia CVF Director's Walk



### YRE 301 Princeton – 10 km – Rated 1B

**This walk qualifies for the CVF Cenotaph Walking Program**

The walk begins at the Princeton Visitor Centre on Highway 3, just to the east of the town centre. If you are entering Princeton from the east it will be on the right side of the road just before the town centre. If entering from the west it will be on the left side of the road just after the town centre. Plenty of parking is available at the Visitor Centre. *You may find a flashlight useful when you go through the tunnel – not mandatory but useful.*

1. From the Visitor Centre turn right and take the gravel path up to the bridge. Cross over the river on the bridge, turn right on Bridge Street. (unsigned – follow sign to City Centre)
2. Follow Bridge Street for two blocks to Kenley Ave (big clock at corner). Cross over Bridge Street at the crossing and continue along Veteran's Way (the Cenotaph is on your right).
3. Veteran's Way turns into Vermillion Ave. Continue down the left side of Vermillion and at the foot of Vermillion follow the sidewalk around to the left to Highway 3.
4. Cross Highway 3 carefully at the crosswalk and continue straight ahead on Aspen St (unsigned).
5. At first crosswalk, turn right to cross Aspen and continue on the paved trail going under the 'Princeton Gateway'. This is the Trans Canada Trail.
6. Follow the rail bed, going through a 1000 foot long tunnel and over a bridge.
7. When passing a fenced area, the "Ochre Bluffs" are on your right. There are many different types of stones/rocks in this area - available for viewing at the Visitor Centre. Please do not cross the fence as this is sacred native land.
8. Continue on the rail bed until you meet the landslide area on your right, river on your left and power line (red ball) overhead and Highway 3 in the distance. This is the turn around point.
9. Return back along the rail bed towards and past Princeton.
10. Follow the trail to a Pavilion with a red roof. Bear right and go down a gravel path which leads under Highway 3. On the other side turn left on the paved trail and turn left again to follow the sidewalk over the bridge, back to the Visitor Centre.
